

1 '83.

2 Q My question was: When did you last have sexual
3 intercourse with Don Lewis?

4 A That was it. Mike followed me down there, and
5 he followed me down there, and we decided that we would
6 try to work it out, and it has just not worked out.

7 Q Now, you traveled to the state of Ohio one
8 weekend with Don Lewis, did you not?

9 A No, I have never been out of the state with
10 him.

11 Q Were you in the Keys with Don Lewis or the
12 Bahamas with Don Lewis?

13 A No.

14 Q Did you ever go away with Don Lewis for a
15 weekend?

16 A No.

17 Q Now, your husband bought you a cat a couple of
18 years ago after your cat died. I believe his name was
19 Pearly?

20 A The one that died was, yes.

21 Q And you had Pearly for 15 years?

22 A Thirteen years.

23 Q And Michael thought it would be a good idea to
24 buy some more cats and give you something to occupy your
25 time with rather than to spend it with Don Lewis?

1 Q Did you not receive the papers from your attorney?

2 A All I got was the registration papers. He kept
3 everything else, and the Court ordered him to return all
4 of those pedigrees and everything where I had everything
5 that I sold cats to, and I cannot contact any of them.

6 Q Isn't it true that all of the certifications
7 were returned to you?

8 A They were not. The only thing that he returned
9 were the registrations, and he held onto them so long
10 that I had to give away the cats, the ones that did not
11 die, because I could not take care of them.

12 MR. ESPOSITO: If you want to take a break,
13 we can.

14 THE COURT: No. Go on, please.

15 THE WITNESS: I don't want you to drag this
16 out because Mike told me he would drag this out for
17 the rest of my life.

18 MR. ESPOSITO: Excuse me. Would you please
19 instruct the witness to be responsive to the questions.

20 THE COURT: Yes.

21 THE WITNESS: I'm sorry.

22 THE COURT: She's been responsive.

23 BY MR. ESPOSITO:

24 Q Now, about a year ago, you met a gentleman by
25 the name of Roy Persons, isn't that correct?

1 A I met him in September of this year.

2 MR. CHARLTON: By that, you mean '86?

3 THE WITNESS: Yeah, you're right.

4 BY MR. ESPOSITO:

5 Q And Mr. Persons owns the Discovery and Massage
6 Salon, does he not?

7 A It's the Discovery Institute. It's a
8 psychological firm. They have a license certified massage
9 therapist that does work in his building, and pays him
10 rent on a regular basis.

11 Q Isn't it true that you have become involved
12 with Mr. Persons and, in fact, you are now living with
13 Mr. Persons or have spent time at his house overnight with
14 your child recently?

15 A That's wrong. I have spent nights with him
16 when Jamie was spending the night with her father. Aside
17 from that, I've been living out where I have always lived.
18 Jamie has never been exposed to him.

19 Q Now, I direct your attention again to the
20 testimony that you gave before Judge Miller on October 10,
21 1986 --

22 MR. CHARLTON: I'm going to object to that form
23 of question. If he has it typed up, fine. It is
24 not a memory contest.

25 THE COURT: You do not have to have it typed up

1 to ask her an impeaching question.

2 BY MR. ESPOSITO:

3 Q Do you recall the question that I asked you on
4 October 10 before Judge Miller in which I asked you has
5 Jamie ever spent the night with you at Mr. Persons' home
6 and you answered in the affirmative that she did but she
7 never saw you in bed together? Do you recall that?

8 A She's never spent the night there.

9 Q You're telling the Court today that she's never
10 been to Mr. Persons' house?

11 A She's been to his house during the day when I
12 pick her up after school. We've been over there while
13 he's at work, but she's never been exposed to him.

14 Q Has she ever met Mr. Persons?

15 A No.

16 Q Did she meet Mr. Persons' parents?

17 A No.

18 Q Did you tell Michael this past -- your husband
19 over this past holiday that you needed to pick Jamie up
20 early because Mr. Persons' parents wanted to meet her,
21 and he wanted to get some pictures taken?

22 A I wanted to get some pictures made. I had a
23 coupon at Olan Mills.

24 Q Pictures made of whom?

25 A Jamie.

- 1 Q Just Jamie?
- 2 A Jamie and me.
- 3 Q Jamie and you and Mr. Persons?
- 4 A No.
- 5 Q Does Mr. Persons have a son named Scott?
- 6 A Yes.
- 7 Q And have you hidden Scott in the car when you
8 would go pick up Jamie so that Mr. Murdock would not see
9 the child?
- 10 A No.
- 11 Q And it's your testimony that you are not living
12 with Mr. Persons now?
- 13 A No, I am not.
- 14 Q And you do not spend the night with him?
- 15 A Only when he has Jamie.
- 16 Q Okay. Is Mr. Persons a licensed physician?
- 17 A He's a licensed psychologist.
- 18 Q What does he do?
- 19 A He's a ^{MARRIAGE} ~~a~~ miracle counselor.
- 20 Q When did you first have sexual relations with
21 Mr. Persons?
- 22 A Shortly after meeting him.
- 23 Q And you say that you met him in September?
- 24 A Yes.
- 25 Q And you say that you did not know him in August

1 Q Now, that overlaps with the time when you were
2 pursuing your real estate venture, does it not?

3 A I had to. I was not making it in real estate.

4 Q So, you had a ten month old baby, and you
5 were working real estate, and you were working at Tampa
6 Bay Boat Mart; is that correct?

7 A Yes.

8 Q And then you met Don Lewis, and you had a
9 relationship with Don Lewis; you also had a relationship,
10 did you not, with someone at Tampa Bay Boat Mart?

11 A I did not.

12 Q Did you say to Mike in a bragging sort of a
13 way that you were going to bed with someone at the Boat
14 Mart and that he was paying you three to five hundred
15 dollars a month?

16 A No.

17 Q Now, when you embarked on all of these ventures,
18 real estate and the cat shows, little Jamie stayed at
19 home with her father, did she not?

20 A Any time I was at a cat show, she was with my
21 mother and father.

22 Q When you went out at night to sell real estate,
23 you have testified that she was with her father?

24 A Yes. I never did cat shows at night.

25 Q Who washed the clothes in the house?

1 Q That was in Christmas of 1983?

2 A I think, '82 or '83.

3 Q When you were having the sexual encounters
4 with Mr. Lewis, did you and your husband make love?

5 A We always have, yes.

6 Q Isn't it a fact that Michael could always tell
7 when you were having a relationship with Mr. Lewis because
8 you refused to have sex with him?

9 A I never refused to have sex with Mike. He
10 was always accusing me of having sexual relations with
11 anybody, everybody.

12 Q Now, with regard to Mr. Persons --

13 A Persons.

14 Q Persons. Has Jamie ever seen Mr. Persons in
15 his shorts?

16 A No.

17 Q And your testimony is that she's never seen you
18 and Mr. Persons in bed together?

19 A I have told you that several times.

20 Q Ms. Murdock, you testified that you go to church?

21 A Yes.

22 Q Okay.

23 A Citrus Park Church of Christ.

24 Q Citrus Park Baptist Church?

25 A No.
